AN ORDINANCE REGARDING THE HOURS OF WORK FOR THE CITY'S CHIEF OF POLICE AND AMENDING SECTION 30-2-31 OF THE REVISED CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF NOKOMIS, ILLINOIS

WHEREAS, the City of Nokomis, Illinois (hereinafter, the "City") is an Illinois non-home rule municipal corporation pursuant to Article VII, § 8 of the 1970 Illinois Constitution, organized and operating under the Illinois Municipal Code, 65 ILCS 5/1-1-1, et seq.; and

WHEREAS, Section 30-2-2 of the Revised Code of Ordinances provides for the appointment of the Chief of Police as an officer of the City; and

WHEREAS, Section 30-2-31(C) of the Revised Code of Ordinances states, "The Chief of Police shall be on duty from eight o'clock (8:00) A.M. to four o'clock (4:00) P.M., Monday through Friday and shall be available for duty in case of emergency at all other times"; and

WHEREAS, the corporate authorities find and determine that it is in the best interest of the City that the Chief of Police should not have hours set by ordinance.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NOKOMIS, MONTGOMERY COUNTY, ILLINOIS, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1: The recitals contained above in the preamble of this Ordinance are hereby incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth in this Section

of this Ordinance verbatim, as findings of the Mayor and City Council of the City of Nokomis, Illinois.

SECTION 2: Section 30-2-31 of the Revised Code of Ordinances is hereby amended as follows, with stricken terms to be deleted and underlined terms to be added:

30-2-31 CHIEF OF POLICE.

- (A) <u>Authority</u>. The Chief of Police is the chief executive officer of the Department and the final departmental authority in all matters of policy, operations, and discipline. He exercises all lawful powers of his office and issues such lawful orders as are necessary to assure the effective performance of the department.
- (B) Responsibilities. Through the Chief of Police, the Department is responsible for the enforcement of all laws and ordinances coming within its legal jurisdiction. The Chief of Police is responsible for planning, directing, coordinating, controlling, and staffing all activities of the Department; for its the Department's continued and efficient operation; for the enforcement of rules and regulations within the department Department; for completion and forwarding of such reports as may be required by competent authority; and for the Department's relations with the citizens of the City, the City government, and other agencies.
- (C) <u>Duty Hours</u>. The Chief of Police shall be on duty <u>at</u> such times as may be prescribed by the Mayor from eight o'clock (8:00) A.M. to four o'clock (4:00) P.M., Monday through Friday and shall be available for duty in case of emergency at all other times.

SECTION 3: All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict or inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent that they may conflict.

SECTION 4: In the event that any section, clause, provision, or part of this Ordinance shall be found and determined to be invalid by a court of competent

jurisdiction, all valid parts that are severable from the invalid parts shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 5: This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage and publication as required by law.

SECTION 6: The Mayor is authorized and directed to sign and the City Clerk is authorized and directed to attest to this Ordinance.

SECTION 7: The City Clerk shall publish this Ordinance in pamphlet form and see to inclusion of this Ordinance in the next update of the City Code of Ordinances.
